Old Business

Repeater

Elliot, VA3EJF reported that he had reprogrammed the repeater so that the "tail" after each transmission is now reduced from 4 seconds to 0.5 seconds.

John, VA3MDJ stated that he and John, VA3AAD again had not been able to get together to work on the repeater, as was outlined in the January minutes, but that he was hopeful that some progress would be made shortly.

John, VA3MDJ, suggested that if after ensuring that the repeater is operating optimally, we feel that we still need increased sensitivity, we could consider installing a preamplifier. He stated that these become available occasionally on eBay.






Presentation

Bert, VE3ENA gave a comprehensive survey of digital logic circuits, and their diagrams, and demonstrated a Heathkit experimenter's board that he had built. He had set up on the board a maze of connections that constituted a pulse-counting circuit that activated a seven-segment LED. He also demonstrated a professional-looking digital frequency counter that he had built, based upon a\ 1980's article in QST. He had even etched the printed circuit boards in the counter and bent the sheet metal for the cabinet himself. We regret that we didn't have a camera present to record this remarkable workmanship.
