Sale of Surplus Equipment

After some discussion, it was determined that many members have two kinds of surplus parts or equipment that they would like to sell or otherwise dispose of, but which are more substantial in value than the individual lots usually raffled off at Club meetings:

These are:

1. More valuable items from which Club members would like to realize some cash: items that are perhaps worth more than \$40 or \$50, and
2. Less valuable items, or collections of items, that members would like to donate to the Club for auction..

Solution:

1. It was agreed that members with items in the first of the above categories should provide a list of these to the Club Secretary (John, VA3AAD) . He will distribute the list along with the meeting minutes, so that they can be circulated to the wider community receiving the minutes. Along with an accurate description of each item, the list should show an asking price and include the telephone number of the seller. If they wish, members can display such items that they wish to sell at Club meetings.
2. Items in the second category should be packaged into lots and brought to the next Club meeting, on November 19th, for the **First Annual Nortown Garage Sale**, with each lot labeled with a suggested minimum starting bid price. Jim, VE3GRT, our Club raffle guru, will organize a display of the items that have been brought in and will set up a silent auction where members can write in their bids during the meeting. Instead of a presentation at the end of the meeting, results of the auction will be announced, money collected and winnings distributed, all to enthusiastic applause.

The VE3MHC (SK) 1926 Bremer-Tulley Radio

Tom, VE3BKA, and Elliot, VA3EJF reported that they had spent one session working on this radio, in an effort to get it operating, but without success. They intend to make another attempt and will report on their findings at a later date.
